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ASIAN TEACHER TRAINING 2014



Acacia Waldorf School hosted this year's Asian Teacher Training (ATT) at the school campus and nearby Hacienda Sta. Elena last April 21 up to April 25, 2014. The ATT is similar to the Waldorf Summer Teacher Training that has been held for the past thirty years in the Netherlands. The theme for this year's Asian Teacher Training is "Art in Education".

Over one hundred old and new Waldorf teachers from all over the Philippines and Asia, as well as interested parents and adults participated in the ATT this summer. ATT facilitators from the Netherlands included Paul van Meurs for Blackboard Drawing and Painting, Lizette Stoop for Music, Drama and Form Drawing, Gea Weeren for Moving Games, Martin Stoop for Clay Modelling and Woodwork, and local mentors Malou Medrano for Kindergarten and Elenita Aranas for kindergarten crafts and handcrafts workshops. The ATT included lectures and art/drama/music workshops from Kindergarten up to Class 8.

This is the first time that the Asian Teacher Training is held in the Philippines. The ATT has been held in Bangkok, Thailand every summer for the past twelve years.

Acacia Waldorf School teachers have been attending the ATT in Bangkok through the years. We hope to have another ATT at Acacia Waldorf School again soon.

EASTER FESTIVAL AT AWS

Simple and heartwarming annual Easter festivities, including the much anticipated Easter story and Easter egg hunt were held for the youngest members of our Acacia Waldorf School community last April 20, Sunday, from 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. at the Kindergarten area. A NEW TWO-STOREY ACACIA UPPER SCHOOL BUILDING

A new two-storey Acacia UpperSchool building is currently being constructed at Acacia Waldorf School. The new building will include additional storage and gathering areas for the Upper School students, and was designed by Acacia parent and architect Mr. Noel Saratan. In charge of overseeing the building project are school parents Mr. Gippy Tantoco and Mr. Eddie Galvez. Mr. Saratan also designed the last two clusters of buildings that were erected at the school. Two new classrooms on this new building will be ready for use by the Upper School by end of June 2014.

NEW LOCATIONS FOR THE ADMIN OFFICE, THE MUSIC ROOM AND ADULT-TODDLER ROOM

Acacia Waldorf School's administration office, the Music Room, and the Adult-Toddler classroom are moving to new locations this summer. The Administration office will move from Sofia House to the Class 8/Kalachuchi classroom. The Music Room will move to the Guava Class 8/9 classroom. The new location of the Administration and Music rooms will be closer to the basketball court, the new parking area, and the new Upper School building that is currently being constructed. Sofia House, the yellow building which was formerly the school's Administration office, will be transformed into a new home of the Adult-Toddler classes. Sofia House is located near the gardens of the Kindergarten area and the former Music Room.



A NEW PARKING AREA

Acacia Waldorf School has moved its common parking area for vehicles of the school community to a larger cleared area by the main road, close to the gate of Hacienda Sta. Elena. The new parking area is marked by a larger hand carved and painted Acacia Waldorf School wooden sign at the entrance by the main road. This parking area has lots of trees that provide shade to our vehicles. Drivers may rest at the nearby drivers' waiting shed. During the last months of the school year, some lights were installed in the parking area. More improvements will be made here this summer, including a paving of the inner roads in preparation for the next rainy season.
