Demo and Open Forum on Biochar by PBiA

Members of the community are invited to a demonstration and open forum on biochar on Tue, Nov 25 at 1:00–4:00pm in the Upper School Hall. Biochar, or charcoal made from biomass (i.e. agricultural/forest/garden waste, such as fallen tree branches, wood chips, rice hulls, dried grass), has been gaining traction for its potential to mitigate climate change through locking carbon that might have otherwise been released into the atmosphere into the soil, while at the same time addressing issues of food security through improved soil quality.

Mr. Philip Camara, president of the Philippine Biochar Association (PBiA), will elaborate on the many benefits of this simple and easy-to-create material. The PBiA is a member of the International Biochar Initiative and promotes the production and use of biochar for rice farming and as a soil enhancer.


